A Timeline For 2 Corinthians

- 1. Paul promises to see them after his trip to Macedonia 1 Cor 16:5-7
- 2. Paul changes his plans and decided to visit them first on his way to Macedonia and then again on his way back 2 Cor 1:15-16.
- 3. Paul makes the first visit, but it was so painful both for him and the church 2 Cor 2:1
- 4. After this visit either Paul or his representative was deeply insulted by the anti-Paul party 2 Cor 2:5-10, 7:12
- 5. Because the first visit was so painful and for other reasons, Paul saw no benefit for the second visit and abandoned his plans to visit on his return from Macedonia.
- 6. Paul sends Titus from Ephesus to Corinth with a letter 2 Cor 2:3-9 which many scholars consider to be the severe letter written between 1 & 2 Cor. Titus was there to receive the contribution for poor Christians in Judea. 2 Cor 8:6, 8:16-17. The Corinthians did not give as they should have 2 Cor 8:10-11, 9:5.
- 7. Paul leaves Ephesus and suffers his severe affliction 2 Cor 1:8
- 8. Paul goes to Macedonia, organizes a collection for the poor saints in Judea. He meets Titus in Macedonia where he learns of the Corinthians response to the severe letter 2 Cor 7:5-7.
- 9. Paul writes 2 Cor in the fall of 56 A.D.
