LOOK BACK

1. How was your week? Any highlight or challenge you would like to share?

LOOK UP

Someone read I Peter 2:1-3 aloud.

- 1. "So" or "Therefore" reflects back on the glory and eternal character of God's word. In light of what God's word is to us we are called upon to do two things; what are they?
- 2. Why are we asked to put away these vices? How do these vices affect relationships in the church?
- 3. Why is it that a healthy newborn baby desires its mother's milk?
- 4. How does this speak to a healthy believer's yearning?
- 5. What is the outcome of those who partake of the pure spiritual milk?
- 6. What does Peter mean by "...grow up into salvation."?

Someone read Mark 4:26-28 aloud.

- 1. How does this passage apply to our text? (Hint: Maturity)
- 2. When Peter says, "...if indeed...", he is not calling into question their faith commitment. In language terminology, this is an indicative in a first-class conditional sentence which means the reality of the condition is to be accepted. In other words, we could translate "Since you have tasted..."
- Since we have personally experienced the goodness (graciousness) of the Lord, we have great reason and responsibility to take God's word the way a hungry newborn takes milk.
