Content Questions

1. What was the manager guilty of?
2. In what ways did the manager prepare for his future?
3. What are the three applications Jesus used in vs. 9-13?

Application Questions

1. The man who is in dire straits assesses what the future holds, he thinks ahead acting prudently to maximize his future interest and comfort. How are you practicing this principle? How might this apply to salvation in Christ?
2. Read 1 Corinthians 3:12-15. How can you be prudent and use money generously so that God will richly reward in the life to come?
3. Are you exhibiting godly character in the small things, like the use of money?
4. Can you explain a time when you served God instead of money? Can you share a time when you served money instead of God?

Memory verse: "No servant can serve two masters, for he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and money.:"

Recap: In this parable, Jesus argues that all of life is a stewardship from God. This parable teaches that we ought to think about what the future holds and by thinking ahead, we should act prudently to maximize our future interest. Jesus also teaches that we cannot have divided loyalties; we will either serve God or money.
