Read Nehemiah 5:14-19

- 1. Nehemiah had taken great measures against slavery and the oppression of the poor in 5:1-13.
 - a. In verses 14-15, what historical and cultural facts can we learn?
- 2. Even though Nehemiah had the right (legal authority, culturally acceptable) to the food allowance, he did not exercise his right.
 - a. What application can you make to our day?
 - b. What is legal, culturally acceptable, that perhaps we should refrain from?
 - c. What does Paul say to this in the N.T.? (see Ro 14:13-23)
- 3. How prevalent do you think it is in America that Christians lay down their freedom in Christ for the sake of others? What about you?
- 4. In verse 15, we read Nehemiah's motivation. It is not primarily humanitarian! Why do you think the Bible makes the distinction between man-centered motivation and God-centered motivation?
- 5. What do you believe is the main motivation in much of what passes for humanitarian compassion?
- 6. In vs.17-18 What did Nehemiah provide at his personal expense?
 - a. Why was he expected to do so? (hint: His job required him to)
 - b. How would most today treat a business expense?
- 7. v.19 From whom does Nehemiah seek favor?
- 8. Whom do we often seek favor from?
