2 Corinthians 2:12-17

1. TRIAL (2 Corinthians 2:12-13)

Paul's time in Troas teaches us that "just because there's a *need* doesn't make it a *calling*." Can we relate to this/how do we discern God's unique call on our life?

Describe Paul's perspective in the midst of the trials he's been explaining in his letter?

2. TRIUMPH (2 Corinthians 2:14-16a)

Most Roman citizens would only witness one triumphal procession in their lifetime. What weight does it hold that Christ leads us *always* in triumphal procession?

What should our proper response to being the aroma of Christ to God be/does my life let off a fragrance defined by a knowledge of God and love for God towards others?

3. TESTIMONY (2 Corinthians 2:16b-17)

Why is it critical for us to understand that our sufficiency (complete adequacy) is from God and not ourselves?

Why is the temptation to peddle with God's Word such a prominent temptation today and do you think that the characteristic/practice of sincerity is talked about enough?

How does understanding our triumph in the midst of trials affect our testimony?
